Freedom

Quality care should enable freedom - for you and our clients. The care you deliver will empower clients to live a full and happy life. Imagine the wonderful stories you can curate simply through delivering unrushed care visits on a regular basis. - Paying for caregiver's cars to be serviced once a year and valeted every six months
- Providing a company mobile phone
- Organising team events and social days (we love BBQ's and bowling nights!)
- Free carer wellbeing programme Angel Care
- Holding regular caregiver meetings for sharing the highs and lows
- Hosting caregiver of the month and year awards.

The Visiting Angels way

If you speak to any of our Angels, you'll hear how working with us is very different to previous care jobs they've experienced. The nature of the work we do and the clients we support mean that many of the negative stories you hear in the media about working in care simply don't happen here.

- Our visits are not rushed our clients receive the time they need for their tailored care plan. We operate on a minimum one-hour visit basis so that you have time to care.
- We pay our caregivers for travel time between visits and visits are scheduled sensibly.
- Our clients' care is private client rate this means we are not forced to deliver care at discounted council prices. Because when that happens, wages are pushed down, and everyone loses out.
- Our caregivers are not forced to work long hours
 you are paid above industry standard and
 rewarded in other ways too, so you shouldn't feel
 like you have to work extended hours just to make a
 decent wage.
- We have a considerably lower staff turnover rate than the national average, so you won't be plugging the gaps in empty rotas. You will also be seeing the same clients each week on hours that you choose so you can really get to know your clients.

Sometimes it's just nice to hear someone say 'thank you' for your hard work. Our care teams really make the world of difference to our clients and their families. Apart from the regular notes of thanks we receive from clients, we also thank our care team in a variety of ways:

- Long-service loyalty bonus.

We are also really good at listening, we have a carer satisfaction survey every 6 months and you can always speak to the owners of the business or any of the management team. We want to help and if we don't know about something we cannot fix it so we encourage feedback.

When our caregivers pass their first 90 days with us, they receive their Angel Wings in a graduation ceremony. We celebrate you becoming a fully-fledged Angel. You will have received training and support up until this point, but it won't stop there. We'll provide continuing professional development to further your career in care for as long as you're part of the VA family. As you stay with the Visiting Angels Family you will earn your bronze, silver and gold wings as a carer recognising the amazing work that you do for your clients.

VAAcademy

Sometimes the role of a caregiver can feel daunting, especially to those new to working in the field. We invest in you to ensure you are confident in all the typical scenarios you may find in a client's home.

Our VA Academy is designed to empower you in your workplace - don't forget, we're all about our carercentric approach. That means putting you first so that you can go above and beyond for your clients.

In over 30 hours of classroom based learning you will be equipped with all the skills and knowledge you need to deliver the highest quality and appropriate type of care to each of your clients. We train in the classroom at each Visiting Angels branch because people learn better when they are learning together. Its important to us that you realise that you are part of a team.

We also support our carers with additional industry training. If you want to do level 2 or three in Adult social care we will pay for your training. 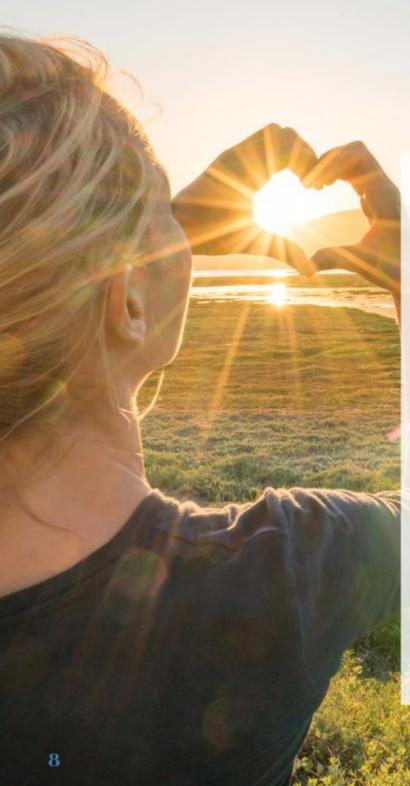

Career development

We have a range of roles for caregivers and those who support them at Visiting Angels. Whether you are new to the industry or are an experienced care worker, we have opportunities for you to progress your career.

Apprentice Caregiver - part of the National
Apprenticeship Service, you'll earn while you learn and
achieve a nationally recognised qualification.

Caregiver/Senior Caregiver - the majority of our roles at Visiting Angels are filled by our caregivers - also lovingly referred to as Angels by ourselves and our clients. You will fulfil a range of tasks depending on your clients' needs including companionship, personal care and more complex care. Your work means that people can maintain their independence and stay in their own familiar surroundings for as long as possible.

Care Co-ordinator - you form the vital link between caregivers and clients. Working closely with the managers at your Visiting Angels office, you'll be scheduling visits and ensuring a client's latest support needs are communicated.

Care Supervisor - if we've said it once, we'll say it a million times, our carer-centric approach at Visiting Angels means that if we reward and recognise the hard work of our caregivers, the quality of delivery will follow. Ensuring the highest quality of care is consistently delivered through our teams of caregivers, this role is essential in aligning the skills needed to deliver care, levels of employee satisfaction and client delivery standards.

Registered Care Manager - with overarching responsibility for the care team, this role also ensures we maintain regulatory standards. This role requires emphatic attention to detail, communication skills and someone not afraid to meet challenges head on.

We also have offices around the UK, so if your personal circumstances mean you need to move, your job may be able to move with you.
